November Day Cruise, by John Garfield

The Club has selected a trip to Clifton and Waco this year. We will begin on Saturday, November 16th starting in two groups (Fort Worth and Dallas) as follows:

Fort Worth will meet at 9:45 at First National Bank parking lot at I-35W and just north of Alsbury St. (in front of Albertsons). We will schedule to leave for Hillsboro at 10:00 AM.

Dallas drivers will meet at 9:45 at Quick Trip (5400 I-35E, Waxahachie). We will schedule to leave for Hillsboro at 10:00 AM.

Both groups will meet at the new Buc-ees in Hillsboro by 11 a.m. to leave for Lake Whitney by 11:15. We will leave Buc-ees and take exit 368B (or stay on access road) to Old Brandon Rd. and head west to Waco St (turn left). Go one block (turn right and hold here to regroup). Take highway 22 west past Whitney to Lake Whiney and over the dam. Just beyond the dam, turn left into Bosgue Inn for lunch by 12:00.

After lunch, head west on 22 to Clifton, turn (left) and go 10 miles to Clifton. Note: bridge is out going into Clifton and we have to go west and follow detour signs back into Clifton. Turn right into downtown. Car museum is on the left just past downtown shopping area. (Some may want to go shopping here, it is a one block long area with on street parking.

We will plan to leave Clifton by 2:00 for half hour drive to Waco on highway 6.

Follow highway 6 to Interstate 35, head north and exit at 335A. Here you can make choice of going left to the Silo shopping (and ice cream), visit the Dr. Pepper Museum (two block away to the north-west), or continue on I-35 access road to the Ranger Museum. Here, spend what time you want on your own and continue north to home.

For the last three years, an intrepid group of NTVT members have gone "cruising" on the ocean, not on Main Street. Those of us who have gone on these trips have really enjoyed them, seeing new places, making new friends, and getting better acquainted with other NTVT members. We made two trips in the Caribbean, and one to Alaska.

In August of 2025, we are heading east, to Boston where on August 16th we will board The Majestic Princess for a 7-day cruise stopping at 4 ports: Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada; Sydney, also in Nova Scotia; Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island; and Portland Maine. At sea along the way we will enjoy fine dining, relaxing activities, and general good times. In the ports, we have many options for excursions or we can explore the sights on our own. Halifax has many historic and scenic places to visit; Sydney is known for its beauty and is considered the center for Canadian Celtic culture and music; Charlottetown, the capital of the smallest province in Canada, Prince Edward's Island, offers small-town charm in a dynamic city. And of course, Anne of Green Gables fans will recognize many local places from that novel; several points of interest will feature museums that will please fans of that novel. And our last port will be back in the USA, Portland, the largest city and capitol of Maine. Here we can visit a renovated historic Old Port, see Kennebunkport, or visit the Henry Wadsworth Longfellow House.

The whole trip sounds exciting, and I hope you will consider joining the 6 or 7 couples who have already booked during the special-pricing period that ended October 31.
