Meeting Minutes, June 14, 2014, by Brad Kershaw, Secretary

Bill Stepina opened the meeting and welcomed our new and recent members. There were 38 members in attendance; no guests were present. The meeting minutes from May 17th, published in the newsletter, were approved by the members present.

Tom Ossorio presented the treasurer's report. Tom also had NTVT T-shirts for those who had not picked them up.

Bill congratulated John and Cece Congleton on their 1st place senior primary and Dom Zanella on his 1st place late model award received at the VTCI convention in New Orleans last month. Bonnie Kershaw was recognized with a Gold Award for the NTVT newsletter. Bonnie gave a summary of the events and great hospitality of the Acadian Thunderbirds. Brad noted some of the highlights of the judging and unique T-birds in attendance.

John Garfield presented an opportunity to take a JFK trolley tour for our July meeting. The trolley can pick us up at a nearby restaurant for a one hour and provide a narrated tour of the notable sights surrounding the JFK assassination in Dallas. For a group of 30 to 35 the cost should be nearly half price (approx. \$12). This should be an interesting event and a preview of a possible event for the 2015 convention. Details will be in the next newsletter.

Brad Kershaw provided an update on the planning for the 2015 VTCI Regional Convention. Dan Sublette and Brad Kershaw have agreed to be Co-Chairs of the event. The steering committee will consist of the current officers, co-chairs, and committee leaders. Members from the steering committee met with representative from the Arlington Sheraton hotel on June 13th. We had to change the dates to May 14-16 since the previous dates were not available We verbally agreed to a plan of room guarantees, banquet facilities, hospitality suite, and registration/meeting rooms. The hotel will prepare a contract and Tom Ossorio will finalize the arrangements. Betsy prepared a list of committees and tasks from our past regional in 2010 and the international convention in Houston last year. This will provide a guide to the work necessary to host a successful convention. The steering committee will be reviewing possible events in the near future and provide updates to the club at our regular meetings. Betsy has agreed to lead the online registration effort. John Garfield has agreed to lead the judging committee. Brad encouraged all to review the list of committees and tasks to see where each member might best contribute to the success of our convention.

Members were encouraged to keep the Virginia Hutto Classic car show on their calendars for September 27-28th 2014. If you are interested in judging, please contact Dan Sublette. Marion Herbst indicated that rooms at the Eastland LaQuinta were filling up fast.

Member Highlight: Dan Hubert

When I was 16-years-old, my mother, Stephany Hubert, bought me my very first car. I had recently obtained my driver's license in November of '59 and was very eager to get behind the wheel of a fancy new vehicle. My mother owned a new 1958 Ford Thunderbird and felt it was a reliable, safe, and classy car which led to her decision to purchase a Thunderbird for me as well. Luckily, she allowed me to pick out the exact one I wanted. It was a gorgeous 1957 model with a white exterior and a bronze and black interior. I was the only student at my high school with a Thunderbird. All of my classmates admired my car; and although I was already a fairly popular boy, I felt that my new car elevated my status, especially with the young ladies.

Driving was an exciting new experience for me, and the fact that I had such a beautiful car in my possession made it that much sweeter. As a teenage boy, I was no stranger to mischief and found myself participating in drag races around town. Most of the competitors drove Corvettes and doubted not only my driving ability, but also the performance of my car. I knew I could take them on. My car had a 3 speed transmission with overdrive and two 4-barrel carburetors, which made it incredibly fast. The other racers might have thought they could beat me, but they never succeeded. I always won, and it felt great. I drove a stunning, well built car, and it changed my life.

I continued to drive the car for about 5 years. It was my pride and joy. Eventually, I made the decision to part with it in 1965 and move on to something newer. But, as timed passed, I regretted selling it as much for the memories as the value of it. Today, this car is known as an E-Bird, which is very rare. I've tried to locate my original car several times over the years, but have been unsuccessful. Since I was unable to find my original car, I decided I would search for another, but didn't have the opportunity to purchase one until my recent retirement. Now, I am living the dream and I'm filled with the exciting, joyful memories of my youth.
